- Sharing achievements

My Body:

- Sensory play and body awareness
- Gross motor- Sensory circuits- stepping over, rolling over, ball skills, throwing, balance, co-ordination, running, bouncing, etc.
- PE- Victorian games: croquet, quoits, skittles, hoop and stick rolling,
- PE- Movement stories based on Time to Move - 10 Pieces, Planet Mars BBC Dance resources
- Ride on vehicles- bikes, scooters, go-carts, etc.
- Fine motor activities- sensory activities, decorating planets, pencil control, stickers, building towers, spinning tops, train sets, etc.

Literacy:

- Spoken language and communication
- Listening and responding
- Engaging with a sensory story

- Anticipating what will happen next in a familiar story
- Massage stories including planet roll and Queen Victoria's bathing machine

- Phonics- Recognising and reading letters and sounds

- Colourful semantics to create a simple sentence, describe a scene

Maths:

- Number games and activities including Victorian games
- Number songs- 5 little men in a flying saucer, etc.
- Number- rote counting, counting objects, reading and writing numbers, matching numbers to objects
- Calculation: matching groups of objects, counting objects in groups, sharing objects into groups
- Place value- counting, sequencing numbers, making marks to represent numbers, matching numerals to amounts
- Capacity and volume- full/ empty, how much does it hold, measuring products in cups, jugs and other vessels.
- Vocabulary- numbers, sharing, double, more, less and capacity language

My Independence

- Attention skills- individual and joint
- Identiplay- Washing dolls and changing clothes, cleaning hands
- Personal care - Focus on washing hands and brushing hair.
- Ride a scooter/ tricycle
- Eating together at a table independently and appropriately
- Cooking- simple sweet treats, marshmallow crispie cakes. Basic skills and food preparation- slicing, chopping, mixing, etc.
